

Inspired by the vision of the great Sardar Patel, Hon. Bhaikaka and Hon. Bhikhabhai founded the first college of this newly designed educational township called Vallabh Vidyanagar. The college named Vitthalbhai Patel and Rajratna P T Patel Science College came into being in 1947 stands as a reputed centre of higher education in this rural landscape. Steeped in its own unique identity and tradition, the college has laid the foundation for future scientists, entrepreneurs, educationists, spiritual leaders and social leaders.

V.P. & R.P.T.P. Science College - A Profile



Vitthalbhai Patel & Rajratna P T Patel Science College was founded in 194 7. It is one of the oldest and premier science colleges of Gujarat. It is named after Vitthalbhai Patel, the eminent freedom fighter who became the first Indian President of the Central Legislative Assembly during the British regime. It was with this college that the educational process began in the newly founded Vallabh Vidyanagar, which later flowered into a unique township with institutions of education for all levels and branches from KG to PG. The college was inaugurated by Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, the Iron man of India, and is named after his elder brother Vitthalbhai Patel.

VP & RPTP Science college is a constituent college of SP University and is governed Charutar Vidya Mandal (CVM), which is a leading educational society founded in 1945 in Gujarat State and was chaired for 35 years by the eminent administrator Dr. H. M. Patel, retired ICS and Ex-Finance Minister of the Union Government. Since 1994 CVM was headed by Dr C. L. Patel. Presently Er. Bhikhubhai B. Patel is heading the CVM. This college was started with combined disciplines of Arts and Science. Till 1959, the college was imparting undergraduate and post-graduate education as well as related research activities in the Science, Humanities and Social Sciences. Later, with establishment of independent post-graduate departments and a separate Arts College, it became a college fully devoted to Science. During 1977, due to implementation of new (10+2+3) pattern education, it shed preparatory classes and became a degree college. After this, with some transitional turmoil, it has been constantly progressing with manifold developments. Owing to its outstanding record and growth-oriented approach, the college has won the award of the best science college of Gujarat State thrice in succession. In 2010, the college was selected as College with Potential for Excellence by UGC and awarded a grant of one crore twenty five lakhs. The status of CPE was renewed by UGC and a sum of Rs. 1.30 Cr. has been allocated to

college for the period of 2014- 2019. The college has been awarded 'A' Grade by NAAC, Bangalore and 'A+' Grade by KCG, Ahmedabad. National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) of MHRD, Government of India, ranked V. P. Science college on 61 Position in India (2017), 11th among Science Colleges in India and 2nd in the State of Gujarat. V. P. Science College is the only college from Sardar Patel University ranked in top 100. The UGC hor granted Autonomous status to this College. The College will remain affiliated to Sardar Patel University.

At present the college offers B.Sc. degree and Honours programes in the following subjects as per New Education Policy-2019:

(1) Physics (2) Chemistry (3) Mathematics (4) Botany (5) Zoology (6) Microbiology (7) Computer Science (8) Electronics (9) Industrial Chemistry. Self financed courses are available in the subjects of (1) Industrial Chemistry (Vocational) (2) Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA).

Facilities for the doctoral studies (PhD) are available in the subjects of Chemistry, Microbiology, Industrial Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, English Physics. The College has well-equipped laboratories and teaching learning is done effectively with the student teacher ratio of 25: 1. BSc [Sem I & II] students are required to attend Language Laboratory, where they learn spoken English with the help of audio visual aids. A well equipped Language Laboratory helps student to acquire good command over communication Skill in English. The college has a Digital English Laboratory where students are trained for SCOPE examinations. Mathematics and Statistics too have laboratory experiments prescribed in their curricula. The college library has its own infrastructure, a separate automated library with about 50,000 books and 42 periodicals.

The day at the college starts with a prayer. The college has its own counselling system which helps students to resolve their problems and which keeps an eye on their educational progress. In order

to help out the academically weak students, a special provision of 'Bridge Course' and 'Remedial classes' is made every year. To increase computer literacy among students 'Learn Computer' Program is conducted every year. Internet facility is available to all students. To increase Internet access, the college offers free Wi-Fi facility in the campus.

The student strength at the college has always been consistent. This is due to the quality teaching, discipline and the facilities available at the college. Every year, campus interviews are arranged at the college for interested. Many of our bright students have secured good placements at various industries, government and private organizations.

The total strength of the teaching faculty at the college is 56, out of which 40 have Ph.D. degree, 6 have M. Phil. degree. The faculties keep interacting and updating their knowledge in their respective field by attending national and international conferences and seminars. The college has a democratic structure and many healthy practices are in place. It constantly strives to achieve excellence in its academic pursuits. It has rich learning resources, the right kind of academic ambience and a whole hearted support from the Management.

Admission



Admission Forms

- (1) For FY B.Sc. (Sem-I) forms have to be filled up online (GCAS Portal) / offline. College may help the student to fill the form. (Student may visit college website for details vpscience.org).
- (2) Students desirous of seeking admission to this college in SY & TY B Sc should personally come to the college to fill up the specified form which can be obtained from the college office. After admission is granted, the fees have to be paid within the stipulated time limit.

Documents Required

Along with the duly filled application form, the following documents are to be submitted:

- Original Marksheet of Std.12th and two Photo copies
- 2. One Photo-copy of School Leaving certificate (LC)
- 3. One Photo-copy of attempt certificate of Std. 12th
- 4. One Photo-copy of Std 10th Marksheet
- 5. If you belong to SC/ST/OBC/EWS/Minority category, one Photo-copy of Caste Certificate
- Students who have passed from other than Gujarat HSC Board will have to attach provisional eligibility certificate (PEC) which can be obtained from Sardar Patel University
- 7. Photocopy of Aadhar Card and a Passport size Photograph
- 8. In case of a break in the studies, the candidate will have to present a Court Affidavit stating the reason for the same
- 9. Foreign students will have to produce a Police Clearance Certificate. Admission to such students will be routed through the International Students Centre of the University.

General Instructions Regarding Admission

1. Beware of admission agents for seeking

- admission. The college has not appointed any agent. Parents can contact the Principal directly or the Admission Committee members.
- 2. The annual fees also includes Personality Development Programme charges, Internet Charges, Infrastructure and other facility charges.
- 3. As per the rules of the Govt, of Gujarat since 1985-86, all girl students are exempted from tuition fees.
- 4. If students from other than Gujarat HSC Board are not able to produce final eligibility certificate latest by the end of the first term, his /her term will not be granted and the fees paid will not be refunded.
- 5. The caution money can be refunded, before leaving the College. For this, a student has to submit a written application from 15th Aug. to 15th Oct. A student will have to present the original fee receipt and 'No Due' certificate of the College Library and NCC/NSS to claim caution money.
- 6. The college and hostel fees once paid will not be refunded under any circumstances. (UGC/ State Govt, rules will be applicable)
- 7. Hostel facilities are available for those students who live more than 2 5 km away.

General Rules and Regulations of the College

- 1. The students are required to collect all the information prior to taking admission to a particular programme.
- 2. For the students staying in college hostel, it is compulsory to take food in the hostel mess, (wherever it is available).
- 3. Ragging of students or any such kind of activity is strictly prohibited inside the college and hostel premises.
- 4. No Programmes can be arranged in the college except those permitted by the Management, University or Government.

- 5. The use of Mobile phones is strictly prohibited inside the college. The Charutar Vidya Mandal reserves the right to take action against any students violating this rule. 6. Student staying in hostel must inform the Hostel Rector about the personal vehicle he/she is in possession of.
- 7. Smoking, consumption of Alcohol, Pan Masala/ Tobacco or chewing gum will be considered breach of discipline and liable for penalty.
- 8. Students must obey all the rules and regulations of the college, the Management and the University.
- 9. Student indulging in the activities that damage the college property will be punished severely and will be penalized.
- 10. Private tuition is not allowed. To help out academically weak students, the college arranges remedial classes every year.
- 11. The behavior of the student with one and all should be courteous and polite. As per the rules and regulations of the college, the principal reserves the right to penalize or dismiss any student violating this code of conduct.
- 12. **Sick leave or other leave:** A certificate stating absence due to sickness, participation in Sports/NCC/NSS or co-curricular activities should be submitted to councilor teacher within two days of the recovery or completion of the event. The certificate submitted after the prescribed time limit will not be taken into consideration.
- 13. The students are required to attend all theory, practicals and tutorial classes. Those who wish to avail leave of absence due to unavoidable, compelling reasons should apply in a specified form to the Principal and obtain his prior permission before availing leave of absence. Defaulters will be strictly dealt with.
- 14. **Identity card:** All students admitted to this college will be issued identity cards. Every student has to wear his /her identity card and show it as and when asked by any authorized person. If a student is found without the identity card disciplinary action will be taken against him/her.
- 15. All legal matters are subject to Anand Jurisdiction.

Scholarship

Scholarships are awarded to deserving students of

SC/ST/OBC and economically backward students as per rules. The information for such Schemes will be displayed on the college notice board.

Assessment (Internal and External)

The assessment includes 50% Internal and 50% external (as per NEP 2020)

The university has a system of 30% Internal and 70 % External evaluation. The college conducts one internal examination at the end of semester and few other evaluation modules are in place for internal evaluation.

In internal assessment, the students will have to score 25% marks in each of the Courses and 40% aggregate. In external assessment, the student will have to score 40% marks in each Course. Overall, the aggregate of the internal and external for particular course should be 40% marks. If a student could not appear in any of the internal tests on medical grounds or any other valid reason, he/ she can appear in Arrear Test, for which prior permission is required.

Students found copying or carrying unauthorized material, aiding and using unfair means in the examination hall will be punished as per the rules of the college & University.

Guidelines for appearing in the University Examination

The acceptance of examination form of the students for the relevant examination does not automatically make him/her eligible to appear at the examination.

- 1. **Theory Attendance:** As per University rules, 80% attendance is compulsory; Otherwise, the student will be detained and will not allow to appear in University Examination.
- Practical: Regular attendance in laboratory is essential. A student should produce his/ her journal duly certified by the Head of the Department stating that he/she has satisfactorily completed the laboratory assignment. This certificate will be issued only, on the basis of attendance and work done in the laboratory.
- Internal Marks: The student is required to obtain minimum internal marks prescribed by College/University.

Co-curricular Activities



The college conducts various co-curricular and extracurricular activities round the year. Activities like lectures by the subject-experts, seminars, science exhibition, quiz contest, debate and elocution, excursion and study tour, Industrial visit, sports day, cultural activities, article writing competition for the college magazine are arranged for the overall development of students.

NCC/NSS/SPORTS

For all the students of BSc/BCA, it is mandatory to join either NCC, NSS or Sports as per Sardar Patel University norms.

Sports:



Our college is permanently affiliated to Sardar Patel University and is recognized by UGC under 2(F) and 12(B). In pursuance of policy of NAAC, college has established an Internal Quality Assurance cell (IQAC) for post accreditation sustenance activity.

The basic role of IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic action to improve the administrative performance of the college. Counselling Cell:

All the students offirst year are allotted Teacher - Counsellors on the very first day of the college. The counsellors monitor the students' attendance, work, and progress. The counsellors meet the students at least once a week at the allotted time. The counsellor is a link between the college, the students and the parents.

Anti Ragging Cell:

Ragging is strictly prohibited in this institute. We also bring it to the notice of our students that in case of such incidents, strict action will be taken as per the provisions of Anti-Ragging Law, directions of the Supreme Court and the State Government. The matter generally is discussed during counselling sessions, Parents' Meeting and the orientation programme for students. The consequences of any such behaviour are brought to the notice of students as well as parents. It has been the policy of the management to eliminate any such behaviour and likewise instructions are given to all teaching and non teaching staff. In the known past we have not received any complaints from any of oui students regarding ragging. No such case has ever been reported. However, we believe that prevention is better that cure and hence we take all adequate measures to prevent such behaviour.

As per the rules of UGC & State Government, every Student and his/her parents are required to sign an undertaking that they and their wards will not indulge in Ragging.

Coaching for Entry in Services:

Success in any types of competitive examinations for administrative posts conducted lay IJPSC, GPSC, banking etc is a tough task. It is important to set a goal in the initial years of graduation and start working accordingly. The preparation of such types of examinations will be faster if a group of students prepare together. This club is formed for the benefit of student of our college to make them aware about such types of examinations. Various activities like seminars, orientation programmes, quiz, essay writing competitions etc. are organized throughout the year to strengthen the ability of the aspiring students.

The club also invites successful candidates who passed such examinations to guide the students. The college has purchased a number of books fo r preparation of the same. The club also provides study material in soft format for the preparation of the examinations.





Training and Placement Cell:

Training and Placement Cell of college is actively engaged in the training and placement of students who wish to join industries or any available job. Every year students of Chemistry and Ind. Chemistry and other branches get an opportunity to get recruited during the placement meets. The cell also organizes career counselling for Third year students regularly.

Internal Complaints Committee:



Science Club

The college has a separate building for library. The college library is a rich and well-endowed one with a total 52856 books. It subscribes to 50 periodicals and magazines and 7 Newspapers . INFLIBNET facility is also available. Faculties, research scholars and student can access online 6 Lakhs e-books and 6000+e-journals. It is fully computerized with INFLIBNET SOUL 2.0 software. All the books are circulated with bar code system. Due to this, the process of books circulation has become faster. Recently, we have installed RFID facility through which issue and return of books can be done by students themselves. For this the staff and students have been issued smart identity cards.

The library building has a large reading room with a seating capacity of 150 students. Ten Computers with internet connections have been installed in the reading room where students can also read general periodicals and magazines.

Apart from this, students can avail books from the textbooks subjects are given Bhaikaka library also by paying a membership fee. The college has a Book bank system. Under this scheme, the text book of various students throughout the year. There are many books for competitive exams such as IPS, IAS, Banking etc.

Internet Facilities:



- 5. The fees/charges once paid are non refundallble.





Job Oriented Programmes (Vocational Courses)



INDUSTRIAL CHEMISTRY: Dr. P. M. Patel(HoD)

This is a three years degree Programme. For the most part this course is general in nature. The Industrial Chemistry graduates can be absorbed in any Chemical Industry. The course covers almost all the aspects of a Chemical industry like production, quality control and effluent treatment or even in technical marketing of products. They can be employed in village industries based on agricultural raw materials or agro-based industries such as insecticides. They can also be employed by government in factory inspectorate, pollution control and by other such agencies.

After a BSc degree in Industrial Chemistry, students may opt for MSc degree Programme with various applied science subjects like Industrial Chemistry, Paint Technology, Oil Technology, Plastic Technology etc. including Pure Chemistry. Facilities for, such studies are available on the campus. Moreover, the Department of Industrial Chemistry is a recognized research centre offering PhD degree in Industrial Chemistry.

Eligibility Criteria: Any candidate who has passed HSC (Maths & BioGroup) with Science can apply

BACHELOR IN COMPUTER APPLICATIONS (BCA):

BCA is catering to the needs of students aspiring to excel in the field of computers. In this programme, besides computer, students get diversified knowledge of Financial Accounting and Management, Production and Operations Management etc. The duration of the programme is three years. In the three years, each students is required to undertake an 'In-house' Project. This provides an opportunity to the students to tackle real life problems. The course provides a sound academic base from which an advanced career in Computer Applications can be developed.

Future Prospects:

Students have a bright future in the IT field. They could take up jobs as Programmers and software developers and go on to become project managers. These graduates can start their career as junior Programmers and get promoted to the posts of

senior Programmers & Project Managers in the IT sector. A post graduation in the relevant field is always preferred. A BCA student is allowed to take admission directly to second year MCA through lateral entry. They can pursue their career in banking, scientific organizations, academics, software industry etc.

Eligibility Criteria:

Any candidate who has passed HSC (12th standard in any stream) with (i) English and (ii) Mathematics or Computer Science or Statistics, Mathematics & Statistics (combined) or computer Introduction (Arts), Computer (Arts PT) or Economics, Statistics or Economics Mathematics or any other computer related subject can apply for this course.

Culture

Those who stay here always cherish the golden moments of life in the campus. Today, the town has compounded in strength and consolidated itself to take on the challenges of the emerging future. Vidyanagar is a mixed culture of say pan-India. One is sure to find the different ways of cultural exchanges among the students and faculties.

Life

The life at Vidyanagar is all about discovering one's self. To be a part of the life that will offer a lot one should be ready to take up the challenges. Academics at its best, fun and frolics do compete with it. Days are hectic with studies while nights go with fun places filling the air with discussions about the day's happenings and eating out at almost all the places that glitter with neon lights. Roaming till late night is a very common here.

Environ

When one enters Vidyanagar, the lush greenery, which is a sure means of breathing fresh air in all seasons, catches the eyes of the naturalist. Its lush green trees of different types and kinds have not only made the town environment-friendly, but also have created a serene and ever-enjoyable tranquil atmosphere generating synergistic ecstasy in the campus. The campuses are built surrounded with trees of various kinds. Vallabh Vidyanagar is blessed with the splendor of nature. The pollution-free environ, attracting many to make the town their permanent home, add value to the academic life in the campus.

Amenities

Vallabh Vidyanagar has all the amenities which major metropolis may offer; rather it has the best of both the worlds - glamour of a big city and simplicity of a small town. Apart from the academic aspect, Vallabh Vidyanagar has a unique chain of food courts, almost all nationalized and non-nationalized banks and accommodation facilities up to five star levels. It encapsulates the contemporary trends of the youth, while at the same time it attempts to make these trends meaningful by making felt the presence of different spiritual vibes.

Location

Vallabh Vidyanagar embraces a rarity of raison dore behind its origin and a variety of education with its development and growth. Strategically located between Ahmedabad and Vadodara, Vallabh Vidyanagar today has reckoned to be an Active Educational core in the western constituent of India & just six kilometers from India's milk city Anand. One can visit the city of Vallabh Vidyanagar by flying to the International airport at Ahmedabad as well as the Domestic airport at Vadodara. If one chooses to travel by road, National Highway 8 can be used - it takes less than an hour to reach Vallabh Vidyanagar from Vadodara.

Path Traversed

Vallabh Vidyanagar which has a short past but a long history, is a living memorial of Sardar Patel, the Icon. He dreamt of a modern and prosperous Independent India in terms of regeneration of villages through (1) the education, (2) advanced agriculture and (3) cooperative ventures. We are Indeed very fortunate that we have here all the three: Vallabh



Vidyanagar is the realisation of his first dream; Institute of Agriculture at Anand (now Anand Agricultural University) is the fruition of the second and Amul Dairy, the cradle of cooperative dairying, is the fulfilment of the third.

BHAIKAKA & BHIKHABHAI : THE CREATOR DUO

The genesis and phenomenal growth and development of Vallabh Vidyanagar, the wellplanned and unique educational township situated in the heart of the Gujarat State, is stranger than fiction. Based on local talent and local resources It is a peerless example of self-reliance and dedication. While working in Sindh (now in Pakistan) as Superintending Engineer in Sukkur Barrage, Yevala in Maharashtra and Ahmedabad Municipality, as a distinguished Chief Engineer, Shri Bhailalbhai Dyabhai Patel, later warmly taken to their heart by the people of Gujarat as 'Bhaikaka', had earned the reputation for his sense of values, discipline, dedication to duty and absolute integrity. Having been born and brought up in a family of strained financial resources in Sojitra village in Kheda district he had known what it meant to be poor. So, while in dedicating himself to the cause of rural India which was sunk in inertia, squalor and abject poverty. Once during a meeting between him and Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel. who knew Bhaikaka as a man with a practical bent of mind, unusual ability and character, Sardar advised him to go to the villages and work for their regeneration. Sardar's wish was tantamount to a command to him. Bhaikaka's irresistible desire to improve the lot of the



poor villagers coupled with Sardar's advice or command impelled him to take early retirement from the service. He saw that the most potent instrument to improve the subhuman life of villagers was to bring higher learning to their very doorstep and thus the concept of establishing institutions of higher education started taking shape. He got in touch with Shri Bhikhabhai Kuberbhai Patel. a dedicated and farsighted educationist, fired by the same ideal. He had played a pivotal role in the establishment of Charotar Education Society in Anand and Narmada Kelavani Mandal at Shuklateerth.

Torrential Rain of Land

They held several meetings in different parts of Kheda (then Kaira) district with about five hundred persons interested in higher education in Anand town. On March 28,1945 it was decided to draw and implement the plan of planting an educational township in a wilderness infested with dacoits which later came to be known as Vallabh Vidyanagar. Bhaikaka and Bhikhabhai worked out an ingenious scheme based on enlightened self-interest. They persuaded the farmers to donate their land free of cost, saying, "Donate your land to us now; well develop and use two-thirds and return you the remaining one-third in course of time". It was explained to them that while having the pleasure of assisting in the establishment of an educational township at no cost to themselves the building plots they would each obtain would appreciate sufficiently not only to cover the value of the land donated, but also leave a handsome margin of profit. It was a win-win situation and the response to it was



overwhelming. At a meeting in Bakrol, a village at a hailing distance from today's Vallabh Vidyanagar, spontaneous offer of land was made to Bhaikaka and Bhikhabhai. A map of the village was spread before the duo and they were asked to mark with a pencil the area needed. Residents of Anand and Karamsad (Sardar Patel's village) followed suit. Thus, a total of 555 acres of land at the intersection of Bakrol, Karamsad and Anand was received in donation. It was a torrential rain of land!

Exemplary Self-reliance

The founders decided to establish two institutions -Charutar Vidya Mandal and Charotar Gramoddhar Sahakari Mandal. The former was to be devoted to the cause of education, that is, establishing colleges and schools and the latter meant to produce the building materials for educational institutions and residential quarters. They were registered on August 10, 1945 and September 7, 1945, respectively. Bhaikaka and Bhikhabhai came to reside in the wilderness in an improvised residence - a hut measuring 8 ft and 10 ft on March 3, 1946. They chose a mango tree and installed themselves under It, in the divine presence of Lord Brahma, the Super Creator, dreaming, planning, breaking a new ground, organizing, getting things done and resolving snarls to plant a city of education far from the

maddening hustle and bustle of cities. It merits a special mention here that Bhaikaka, the Patriarch of Mango Tree, as he was then called, despised the



idea of copying or borrowing know-how and dohow from anywhere. His indomitable faith in the local human material, though inexperienced, propelled him to bake bricks for the buildings locally. He established building material unitsworkshop and foundry, cement pipe factory, tiles factory, rubber factory and prestressed concrete factory to produce, in addition to bricks, lime, timber doors and windows, flooring tiles, hume pipes and various concrete products. The materials thus produced worked out cheaper than in the market and in addition, provided employment to the local people. It is difficult to resist the temptation of recalling here that Bhaikaka invited a Harijan to inaugurate the brick-kiln, a Muslim mechanic to lay the foundation of the workshop and foundry and a Brahmin to lay the first brick of the V. P. Science College. A printing press named as Gramoddhar Printing Press for printing handbills, booklets, books, research journals and question papers were also set up.

Bhaikaka, the man with green thumb, planted a thousand trees. It is to him that we owe the lush-green, stately, shady trees all along the roads in Vallabh Vidyanagar.

First College Born

While many pessimists seriously doubted the success of the ambitious project of establishing about regeneration of villages through modern education and employment and thereby arresting the exodus of promising youth from villages to cities. Sardar Patel,



the unerring judge of men and women, not only wholeheartedly blessed the great adventure but also expressed his tremendous faith in its success. Inspiration, encouragement and unbounded support of the mighty Sardar, blessings of Mahatma Gandhi and extraordinary hard work of the founders ushered into existence Vitthalbhai Patel Mahavidyalaya in June 1947. The birth of the first college, like the birth of the first child, was hailed with a fanfare of trumpets! B.A. and B.Sc. classes commenced between towering walls sans any roof. It is something to write home about that teachers and students carried with cheer bricks and mortar after the conclusion of their classes and sweated along with the skilled and semi-skilled construction workers!

Justice M.C. Chagla, Vice Chancellor. University of Bombay, during his visit to Vallabh Vidyanagar in 1947, was all praise for it when he said, "I came here... and found a new magic. Dreams have come to reality. As the Vice-Chancellor. I am proud that such an ideal college is affiliated to the University of Bombay. I see the seeds of real educational revolution being sown in this soil..."

While performing the opening ceremony of the College, Sardar Patel complimented Bhaikaka. the great public servant, for his tireless efforts and appealed to the public to give him their unflinching support and pray for the realization of his dream of an ideal seat of learning. Jawaharlal Nehru, who laid the foundation stone of



Vallabh Vidyanagar observed "... The first thing have liked is that the activities here have the object of serving village people. The other thing 1 have liked is that you do not care whether your house is ready or not. You know how to start putting it to use and start your activities. Here we find harmony of principle and practice. This institution by itself prepares its requirements. I earnestly hope that the example of this institution will not only be followed in this province but throughout the country..."

It is noteworthy that many reputed men of letters from all over the country joined the Vitthalbhai Patel Mahavidyalaya as teachers in response to the appeal of the founders who ensured that the quality of education imparted was first-rate. In order that new teachers too equip their students with the latest advances In their respective disciplines they sent nearly a dozen teachers to U.K., U.S.A. and Germany for receiving advanced training In research.

Many citizens of Anand and nearby places volunteered generous help in running the college and in the development of the matchless educational township. In the face of a swarm of problems, mostly financial, they stood by the great visionaries and helped them surmount these boldly and imaginatively. Sir C.V Raman and Lady Raman graced the first


